

## **OBJECTIVES**

To ensure that personnel and family get free, comprehensive, high quality health care through regular disbursement of funds and materials to the health care providers and monitoring the standards of health care delivery regularly.

## **VISION**

The vision is to become a leader in the health care maintenance organization business and act as benchmark for the country.

## **MISSION**

The mission is to promote an efficient, effective and comprehensive free health care delivery to the officers and men of the Armed forces and their families.

## **INTRODUCTION**

The National Health Insurance Scheme (NHIS) is a social health insurance programme designed by the Federal Government of Nigeria to complement sources of financing the health sector, and to improve access to health care for all Nigerians.

The main objectives of the scheme as set out in Act 35 of 1999 constitution includes:

- a. To ensure that every Nigerian has access to good healthcare services.
- b. To protect families from the financial hardship of huge medical bills.
- c. To limit the rise in the cost of healthcare services.
- d. To ensure equitable distribution of healthcare costs among different income groups.
- e. To maintain high standard of healthcare delivery within the scheme.
- f. To ensure efficiency in healthcare services.
- g. To improve and harness private sector participation in the provision of healthcare services.
- h. To ensure adequate distribution of healthcare facilities within the Federation.
- i. To ensure equitable patronage at all levels of healthcare.
- j. To ensure the availability of funds to the health sector for improved services.

## **DEFENCE HEALTH MAINTENANCE LIMITED**

In response to the challenge of maintaining medical combat readiness while providing the best healthcare services for all eligible personnel, the Ministry of Defence established the Defence Health Maintenance Limited (DHML).

DHML is one of the Health Maintenance Organisations (HMOs) authorized and regulated by the National Health Insurance Scheme. It brings together the healthcare resources of the Nigerian Army, Navy and Air force and complements this with a network of civilian healthcare Professionals and Facilities. This provides better access and high quality service to the beneficiaries, while maintaining the capability to support military operations, including conditions peculiar to the military environments and military health infrastructural development through regular annual budgeting.

At the Primary health care level, the DHML currently operates about 140 health care facilities nationwide. Those wishing to take advantage of DHML services must register. Another key feature of DHML is that all those who registered will be assigned to a primary care provider (PCP).

A Primary care provider (PCP) is a health care professional or medical establishment to which patient's report to first for their healthcare needs. Primary care providers will be supported by military and civilian medical specialists to whom patients will be referred if they require specialty care.

### **HOW THE SCHEME WORKS**

1. Each employer wishing to participate in the scheme registers with the NHIS and is assigned with a registration number.
2. The employer selects an accredited HMO and supplies all the necessary personal details. The NHIS issues an ID card to the enrollee and their eligible dependant.
3. The PCP takes care of all the military health care issues of the enrollee based on the NHIS benefit package. The PCP will refer the employee to a secondary or tertiary health care provider accredited by NHIS for specialized cases, with approval from the HMO using the established referral guidelines as listed below in the referral section.

4. The HMO will pay the PCP a global capitation of the ~~N~~550 per member per month which has been pre agreed.
5. When the claim is presented, the HMO reimburses the specialist on the pre agreed fee-for-service tariff as prescribed by NHIS. The appropriate referral must be made before payment is made.
6. Claims shall be submitted monthly by the 14<sup>th</sup> day of the month following the month in which the claims are incurred. The HMO will reimburse all confirmed claims within 14 days of receipt of claims.
7. Standardized pharmacy prescription sheets shall be 3-4ply for the distribution to the doctor, pharmacy and HMO for notification of claims.

### **CONTRIBUTION**

Contributions to be paid are earnings related. This currently equates to 15% of the basic salary of the participants. The Federal Government shall be responsible for payment of the contributions. No deduction is made from the salaries of the uniformed personnel's. DHML is funded like any other HMO by NHIS only.

### **SCOPE OF COVERAGE**

The contributions paid on behalf of a participant under this Programme covers provision of health benefits for the participant, five dependants which include a spouse, four children below the age of 18 years.

### **VERIFYING NHIS ENROLLEES ELIGIBILITY**

All Military NHIS enrollee must be registered with one military health care provider as Primary Care Provider (PCP). Eligibility should be verified before providing services and can be verified as follows:

1. Check NHIS Enrollee list
2. Check enrollees NHIS ID card or service ID card.
3. Contact DHML to verify enrollees' eligibility.

### **PROVIDING CARE TO ELIGIBLE NHIS ENROLLEES**

The enrollee will present at a health care provider only when they have a health concern or need medical attention. It is important that the enrollee:

1. Consults with a medical doctor in their assigned hospital (PCP).

2. Receive reasonable access to care and services.
3. Understand the treatment options including drugs, necessary diagnostic tests, and access to the needed specialist care.
4. Is treated with respect, dignity and privacy as well as confidential treatment of their medical information.
5. Receives care in timely and caring manner.

## **BENEFIT PACKAGE**

The benefits derivable to participants and their dependants include the following:

- Outpatient care (including consumables).
- Prescribed generic drugs, pharmaceutical care as contained in the National Essential Drug List (see Section IV).
- Diagnostic tests as contained in the Diagnostic Tests List (see Section II).
- Maternity care for up to four (4) live births for every insured contributor/couple.
- Preventive care including immunization as it applies in the National Programme on Immunization, health education, family planning, antenatal and post-natal care.
- Consultations with specialists, such as Physicians, Pediatricians, Obstetricians, Gynecologists, General surgeons, Orthopedic surgeons, ENT surgeons, Dental surgeons, Radiologists, Psychiatrists, Ophthalmologists, Physiotherapists, etc.
- Hospital care in a standard ward for a stay limited to a cumulative of 28 days stay (after the 15 days covered by capitation), for physical and mental disorders. Thereafter the beneficiary or the Federal Government pays.
- Eye examination and care, excluding the provision of spectacles and contact lenses.
- A range of prostheses (limited to artificial limbs produced in Nigeria).
- Preventive dental care and pain relief (including consultation, dental health education, amalgam filling, and simple extraction).

***Note: All Providers are expected to provide counseling as an integral part of quality care.***

## **EXCLUSIONS**

The following conditions are excluded from the benefits package of the NHIS:

### **(a) Total Exclusion**

1. Occupational/industrial injuries are excluded and would continue to be covered under the Workmen Compensation Act.

2. High technology investigations, except in life-threatening emergencies, e.g. C.T scan, MRI (*See 'Partial Exclusions'*)
3. Injuries resulting from:
  - a) Natural disasters, e.g. earthquakes, landslides, etc (*force majeure*)
  - b) Conflicts, social unrest, riots, wars, etc.
4. Epidemics
5. Family planning commodities, including condoms.
6. Injuries arising from extreme sports, e.g. car racing, horse racing, polo, mountaineering, boxing, wrestling, etc.
7. Drug abuse/addiction
8. Terminal illnesses, including **all Cancers**
9. Surgery
  - a) Transplant, cosmetic surgeries and implants (orthopaedics).
  - b) High cost surgical procedure, including organ transplants, e.g. open-heart surgery, neurosurgery (except Borehole), laminectomy, etc
10. *Ophthalmology*- Provision of spectacles, contact lens, etc
11. *ENT*-Hearing aids and associated appliances
12. *Medicine*
  - a) Management of CVA beyond the initial treatment.
  - b) Tuberculosis
  - c) Chronic renal failure
13. *Paediatrics*
  - a) Congenital abnormalities involving major/extensive surgical repairs, e.g. separation of Siamese twins, omphalocele, etc.
  - b) Chronic congenital defects, e.g. Hirschsprung disease, etc.
14. *Obstetrics & Gynaecology* - Infertility management
15. *Dental*
  - a) Dentures, crowns, bridges, implants
  - b) Scaling and polishing
  - c) Maxillo-facial surgeries
  - d) Root-canal treatment
16. Domiciliary Vist.
17. Periodic Medical Check-up unrelated to illness

(b) ***Partial Exclusion***

- i) Due to the sizeable prevalence, social importance and cost of the underlisted surgical conditions, the HMO would pay 25% of the cost of management while the remaining 75% would be borne by the contributor/employer:
  - o Prostatectomy

- Myomectomy
  - Open Reduction Internal Fixation.
  - ii. For life-saving emergency treatment requiring high technology investigations, the HMO would pay 10% of the cost, and the other 90% paid for by the contributor/employer, e.g. C.T scan, MRI.
  - iii. High-cost Screenings
- For the under-listed screenings, the HMO would pay 10% of the cost while the remaining 90% would be borne by the contributors/employer:

- Ø Prostate Specific Antigen (PSA)
- Ø PAP smear
- Ø Mammogram
- Ø Tumour markers
- Ø Hormonal assays
- Ø Fluoroscopic dye studies
- Ø Radio-opaque studies (Barium Meal/Swallow, I.V.U., etc).

***However, in observance of an existing contractual agreement between employer and employee, the employer may choose to undertake extra cover in addition to the above.***

## **REIMBURSEMENT**

This is made to the healthcare providers for the services rendered to DHML enrollees. It is done via one of the following methods:

1. Capitation.
2. Fee-for-Professional Service (FFS).

## **CAPITATION**

Primary healthcare providers are paid a fixed amount per enrollee per month. The total capitation paid is ₦550 multiplied by the number of assigned membership. This amount is the contribution made to the pool of funds created for the services listed under primary care. It is expected that from this pool of funds, PCP will purchase some primary care services such as drugs and diagnostic tests from a third party(HCP) that is accredited by NHIS if and when these services are not available in-house.

## **FEE FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICE**

The secondary and tertiary health care providers will be paid via a fee-for-professional service method based on the approved referral guidelines and price list of services not covered by capitation.

## **SERVICES COVERED BY CAPITATION**

The primary health care capitation payment of ₦550 per member shall cover the following services:

1. Consultation
2. Emergency
3. Drugs including injections(see Section IV)
4. Laboratory Services
5. Hospital Stay (payment of bed space as per diem to a secondary provider) for a total of 15 days per annum.
6. X-ray
7. Minor Surgery
8. Eye treatment
9. Dental treatment
10. Pregnancy(2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> )

## **SERVICES COVERED BY FEE FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICE (FFS)**

Services covered by FFS include all services not covered by capitation but included in the NHIS benefit package.

### **SUBMISSION OF CLAIMS**

All claims will be processed at:

1. The following are required before claims can be settled:
  - A referral form properly filled including patients' current phone number and address.
  - Authorization code for treatment must be obtained and clearly documented.
  - Acknowledgement slip duly filled and signed by receiving facility.
  - Summary/Breakdown of bill.
  - Summary of treatment/treatment details
  - Drug prescription sheets duly costed according to NHIS price list.
  - Evidence of laboratory investigation done.
  - Consent form where surgery was done
  - All other relevant information for ease of processing the claims.

2. Denial of Claims: Claims submitted by providers will be delayed or denied under the following conditions;
- Referral form or authorization code for treatment was not obtained and included with the claim.
  - Claims submitted for persons not covered by the scheme.
  - Claims submitted without the relevant details stated above.
  - Duplicated claims or claims made for services covered by capitation.
  - Claims made are not in line with NHIS standard treatment guidelines.

## **REPORTS AND DATA RETURNS TO DHML**

The provider is expected to render the following monthly reports to the HMO not later than the 10<sup>th</sup> day following the month of client encounter.

- Encounter Data
- Summary of encounter Data
- Copies of prescription sheets

## **GUIDELINES FOR REFERRALS UNDER THE NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE SCHEME**

### **REFERRALS**

Referrals are undertaken essentially to ensure cost-effectiveness and efficiency in patients' management under the NHIS. It can only be given by a primary health care physician to a secondary or tertiary provider.

### **LEVELS OF REFERRAL**

Entry into the Programme is via the Primary Health Care Provider. At that level, treatment is administered as recommended by the guidelines. Cases that require specialized attention are referred following the laid down guidelines from the Primary to Secondary and tertiary levels.

### **NEED FOR REFERRAL**

A patient may be referred from a Primary to a Secondary /Tertiary healthcare Provider due to need for specialized investigations, for medical/ surgical reasons or other services – diagnostic, physiotherapy etc, or from secondary to tertiary level. Approval by the HMOs is necessary, except in emergencies where he cannot be reached and notification of such should be served within 48hrs.

Referrals should be to the nearest specialist as contained in the list of NHIS registered providers in the area.

## **BASIC PRINCIPLES FOR REFERRAL**

- Ø A referral line must be established.
- Ø There must be a clinical basis for referral.
- Ø A referral letter must accompany every case.
- Ø Primary care physicians are obliged to refer early enough to the next level of care.
- Ø Personal and medical details must be contained in the referral letter.
- Ø All investigations carried out at a lower level must be sent to a higher level.
- Ø The outcome of a referral should be satisfactorily and properly documented.
- Ø Referred cases must be sent back by the specialist after completion of treatment to the referring provider, with a medical report and instructions for follow-up management.

## **INFORMATION REQUIRED FOR REFERRAL**

- Ø Patient's name, gender, age, current telephone number and address.
- Ø Referral location (dept/clinic)
- Ø Patient's hospital number
- Ø Patient NHIS number
- Ø Referring Provider's NHIS registration number
- Ø Referral date
- Ø Clinical findings/investigations and results
- Ø Provisional diagnosis
- Ø Reasons for referral
- Ø The patient's HMO and registration number
- Ø Referring personnel's name and signature

## **RADIUS OF REFERRALS**

Referrals are restricted to the nearest specialist facility accredited by the NHIS. Any referral outside this radius must be justified.

## **SECTION I**

### **ACTIONS AND PROCEDURES AT EACH LEVEL OF HEALTH CARE DELIVERY**

#### **1. *Primary Level***

1. Routine immunization
2. Out-patient care (including consumables)
3. Emergency care (including treatment with listed emergency drugs)
4. Family planning education
5. General patient care (blood pressure, temperature, etc.)

6. Child welfare services.
7. HIV/AIDS and STIs

### 1.1 *Immunization*

Immunization against childhood killer diseases is one of the responsibilities at the primary health care level. The vaccines are BCG, Oral Polio, DPT Measles, Hepatitis B and Vitamin A supplementation. They are sourced from the NPI cold chain stores, either from the Local Government Headquarters, the States, or the Zonal NPI Stores and distributed via the HMO Network of Providers.

### 1.2 *Out-Patient Care*

Services to be offered include proper history taking, examination and routine laboratory investigations to help reach a diagnosis. Laboratory investigations include Blood film for malaria parasite, WBC, Hemoglobin estimate or packed cell volume, urinalysis, stool microscopy, MCS of urine, wound, throat, HVS, Widal test, FBS, Urine pregnancy test, VDRL, ESR, HB Genotype, Blood grouping and cross-matching.

Other procedures at this level include:

#### *Surgical procedure*

- i) Drainage of simple abscess (I&D)
- ii) Minor wound debridement
- iii) Surgical repairs of simple lacerations
- iv) Circumcision of male infants
- v) Evacuation of impacted faeces
- vi) Corrections of cases of simple polydactyl
- vii) Drainage of paronychia
- viii) Other procedures as may be listed from time to time by the NHIS

#### *Internal Medicine*

- i) Malaria and other acute uncomplicated febrile illnesses.
- ii) Diarrhoeal diseases
- iii) Acute respiratory tract infections
- iv) Uncomplicated pneumonia
- v) Simple anaemia (not requiring blood transfusion)
- vi) Simple skin diseases, e.g. Taenia vesicolor, M. furfur, T. Capitis, etc.
- vii) Worm infestation
- viii) Other uncomplicated bacteria, fungal, parasitic and viral infections and illnesses

- ix) Follow-up treatment of chronic illnesses, e.g. hypertension, diabetes mellitus, sickle cell, asthma, glaucoma
- x) Dog bites, snakebites, scorpion stings
- xi) Arthritis and other minor musculoskeletal diseases
- xii) Other illnesses as may be listed from time to time by the NHIS.

#### ***HIV/AIDS and STIs***

- i. Voluntary Counseling and Testing (VCT)
- ii. Health education

#### ***Mental Health***

- i) Anxiety neurosis
- ii) Psychosomatic illnesses
- iii) Insomnia
- iv) Other illnesses as may be listed from time to time by the NHIS

#### ***Paediatrics***

- i) Feeding problems and nutritional services
- ii) Treatment of common childhood illnesses, e.g., (malaria, other febrile illnesses, diarrhoea diseases, uncomplicated malnutrition, failure to thrive, measles, upper respiratory tract infections, uncomplicated pneumonia and other childhood exanthemas, simple skin diseases and viral illnesses)
- iii) Other illnesses as may be listed from time to time by the NHIS

#### ***Obstetrics & Gyneacology***

- i) Acute pelvic inflammatory diseases
- ii) Vaginal discharges
- iii) Routine ANC for uncomplicated pregnancy (ante-natal & post-natal) i.e., 2nd, 3rd and 4th pregnancies.
- iv) Other illnesses as may be listed from time to time by the NHIS

#### ***Ophthalmology***

Treatment of minor eye ailments including:

- i) Conjunctivitis
- ii) Parasitic and allergic ailments
- iii) Simple contusion, abrasions, etc.
- iv) Other illnesses as may be listed from time to time by the NHIS.

### ***1.3 Emergency Care***

The beneficiary requiring emergency treatment shall visit his primary provider or his nearest health facility. He is to offer First Aid treatment before referral.

The procedures include:

- i) Establishing an intravenous (infusion) line
- ii) Simple tracheostomy
- iii) Management of convulsion, coma, etc
- iv) Control of bleeding

- v) Cardio-pulmonary resuscitation
- vi) Assisted respiration (e.g. Ambu bag, etc.)
- vii) Immobilization of fractures (using splints, neck collars, etc) to ease transportation of patients,
- viii) Aspiration of mucus plug to clear airways

***The following emergency drugs and consumables are included in the capitation:***

- i) Inj. hydrocortisone
- ii) Inj. hydrallazine
- iii) Inj. aminophylline
- iv) Inj. adrenaline
- v) Inj. ergometrine
- vi) Inj. diazepam
- vii) nebulizers
- vii) Other drugs as may be reviewed by the NHIS from time to time

***Intravenous infusion Include:***

- i) 5% Dextrose in water
- ii) 50% Dextrose in water
- iii) 5% Dextrose in normal Saline
- iv) 4.3% Dextrose in 0.18% Saline
- v) Normal Saline
- vi) Darrows Solution (full or half strength)
- vii) 10% or 20% Mannitol

#### ***1.4 Family Planning Services***

This includes **family planning education** on the following:

- i) Safe period
- ii) Pills
- iii) Condoms
- iv) Other methods (implant and surgical contraception)

#### ***1.5 Child Welfare Services***

i) Growth monitoring  
ii) Routine immunization  
iii) Nutritional advice and health education, etc and other services to be included from time to time by the NHIS.

### ***3. Secondary and Tertiary Levels***

## **2.1 Surgical Procedures**

All other procedures that cannot be handled at the primary level of care can be undertaken at the Secondary and Tertiary levels, depending on the complexity and the competence of the facility and its personnel, except those conditions listed on the exclusion list.

## **2.2 Internal Medicine**

All other cases that cannot be treated at the Primary level due to lack of facilities, personnel or skills must be promptly referred to either a Secondary or Tertiary centre, except those conditions on the exclusion list.

### **2.3 HIV/AIDS**

- i) Management of cases requiring admission
- ii) Treatment of opportunistic infections

## **2.4 Mental Health**

The following illnesses, amongst others, can be treated at the Secondary or Tertiary levels:

- i) Affective disorders, such as manic depressive illness
- ii) Endogenous depression
- iii). Organic brain disorders with psychiatric manifestations
- iv) Functional disorders, such as schizophrenia
- v). Hysteria

## **2.5 Paediatrics**

All cases that cannot be handled at the Primary level, except such surgical procedures that are on the exclusion list. Simple congenital abnormalities, e.g. cleft palate, and life-threatening congenital abnormalities, e.g. Tracheoesophageal Fistulae (T.O.F), etc, would be handled at the Secondary level.

## **2.6 Obstetrics and Gynaecology**

- i) Specialist consultation
- ii) Multiple gestation/High risk pregnancies
- iii) Caesarian sections
- iv) Ectopic pregnancies
- v) Other obstetrical and gynecological surgical procedures that are not on the exclusion list.

## **2.7 Ophthalmology**

- i) Specialist consultation
- ii) Eye problems, e.g. major trauma, pterygium, glaucoma, cataract extraction and other simple ophthalmological surgical procedures
- iii) Removal of foreign bodies
- iv) Refraction, excluding provision of spectacles and contact lenses

## **2.8 Ear Nose And Throat (ENT)**

- i) Specialist consultation
- ii) Antral wash-out
- iii) Minor treatment, e.g. removal of foreign body
- iv) Surgical operations, e.g. Tonsillectomy, Polypectomy, Tracheostomy, Adenoidectomy, Myringotomy, etc.
- v) Other ENT procedures except those on the exclusion list.

### 2.9 *Pathology*

All investigations, excluding post-mortem, should be referred to appropriately registered facilities at Secondary or Tertiary level of care.

### 2.10 *Dental Health*

Dental services under the auspices of the NHIS are paid for on a Fee-for-Service basis and shall be referred appropriately to the dental surgeon.

### 2.11 *Physiotherapy*

- i. Post-surgical procedure within the prescribed 15 days
- ii Post-traumatic rehabilitation
- iii. Simple chest drainages
- iv. Palsies within 15 days after initial treatment.
- v. Post-CVA therapy within 15 days

### 3. *Hospitalization*

**Enrollees in the NHIS are entitled to hospitalization in general wards only, with the exclusion of meals. However, the use of amenity/private wards and feeding will attract extra charges to the enrollee at the point of use.**

#### NOTE :

- **ANY PRIMARY HEALTH CARE PROVIDER THAT REFERS AN ENROLLEE FOR LABORATORY INVESTIGATIONS OR RADIOLOGICAL SERVICES SHOULD ENDEAVOUR TO PAY SUCH SERVICES.**
- **ALL HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS SHOULD ADHERE STRICTLY TO THE NATIONAL ESSENTIAL DRUG LIST APPROVED BY THE NHIS.**

### AGREEMENT BETWEEN PROVIDERS AND HEALTH MAINTENANCE ORGANISATIO (HMOs)

1. Agreement between the provider and the HMO shall include the following terms:

- a) Acceptance by the provider to provide healthcare services,24

hours a day and 365 days in a year.

- b) Accepting beneficiaries without discrimination. A provider cannot reject a patient except on appeal to the NHIS stating the grounds for rejection and it shall be only after 3 months of initial registration with the provider.
- c) Stock generic drugs based on the National Essential Drugs List.
- d) All prescriptions by the provider must be in quadruplicate. Two copies shall be sent to the pharmacy. A copy to the HMO and a copy retained by the provider, -A provider shall not see a beneficiary as a private patient and patients are to be sent to only NHIS accredited specialist facilities using only the approved referral line.

2. The obligations of the HMOs shall include payment of capitation for primary health care providers and fee for service for secondary/tertiary providers. NHIS shall however regulate all fees payable.

3. The HMO shall ensure continuous monitoring of the health care providers and the providers should allow the HMO easy access for such monitoring.

4. The relationship between the HMO and its affiliated providers shall be governed by the provisions of the Act, the operational guidelines and the contractual agreement executed between them.

## **SUSPENSION AND WITHDRAWAL OF ACCREDITATION OF PROVIDERS**

The Scheme may upon a complaint by the HMO or registered enrollee and after investigation, including affording the provider or his legal representative an opportunity of being heard, cancel or suspend the accreditation of a provider if:

- a) It ceases to operate or is declared bankrupt
- b) It is accredited by virtue of misleading information.
- c) It is incompetent, unable to or incapable of rendering the prescribed services under NHIS.
- d) It lacks the facilities to provide prompt and efficient services to registered beneficiaries.
- e) It breached any term of the agreement with the HMO or NHIS.
- f) It is found to engage in fraudulent activities.
